## DECIDE TO GIVE SACRIFICIALLY

Much of church giving is only token giving, averaging about two percent of income. We have given only what we could easily afford, what we would not really miss.

Experience shows that sacrificial giving begins at five percent of income with proportions under five percent falling into the token giving category.
